

BE IT REMEMBERED that on 14th the day of February, A.D. 2022 the Commissioner Court of Howard County met in Workshop session @ 1:30 PM and Regular session at 3:30 PM with **KATHRYN G. WISEMAN**, County Judge as the Presiding Officer. The following members were present: **EDDILISA RAY**, Commissioner Precinct No. 1, **CRAIG BAILEY**, Commissioner Precinct No. 2 (arrived @ 2:07 PM), **JIMMIE LONG**, Commissioner Precinct No. 3 and **JOHN H. CLINE**, Commissioner Precinct No. 4.

The Workshop was called to order at 1:31 PM.

The meeting was turned over to Jackie Olson, Auditor. Mrs. Olson presented an update of different funds including the Tobacco Rainy Day Fund; the Airport/Industrial Par Revenues & Expenditures; Lease Space on the Echols Tower; Interlocal Agreement in regards to Communication Systems Article II Annual Maintenance Package; Interlocal Agreement in regards to Communication Systems Article III Future Expenses and Maintenance with discussions as needed on each fund. In addition, Mrs. Olson presented a re-cap of the JP Collections for the past several years and discussed reasons for the decline. Mike Averette, JP, also attended and joined the discussion.

Baldomar Cortez, Maintenance, and Commissioner Long discussed various maintenance needs for the County with the Court. The needs are in the District Court Building, Library, and the Coahoma JP Office as well as the status of the boilers, windows and plumbing problems in the Courthouse. No action needed on this date.

Mavour Braswell, Librarian spoke concerning Library accreditation as required by the State. Ms. Braswell also discussed the mural situation that is on the Agenda for the Regular session.

The Court went into Executive Session @ 2:53 PM.

The Court moved from Executive Session @ 3:11 PM with no action being taken and recessed until the Regular session @ 3:30 PM.

Court reconvened into Regular session @ 3:31 PM.

There were the following Registered speakers: Tammy DePauw, Nancy Michaelis and Matthew Grayson all spoke in favor of the mural that the Big Spring High School art class is wanting to do at the little building outside of the Library. Also registered to speak was Jack Page from Boston Globe Whole Life Insurance wanting to make whole life insurance available to employees.
